Advice Letter 316-W Great Oaks Water Company (U-162-W) to the California Public Utilities Commission Requesting Rate Increase Due to Increased Groundwater Charges and Establishment of Interim Rates

Great Oaks Water Company (Great Oaks) transmits this Tier 1 advice letter establishing a change in base rates to pass-through additional groundwater charges (aka, pump taxes) being imposed upon Great Oaks by the Santa Clara Valley Water District effective July 1, 2023. The new rates will be effective July 1, 2023.

Summary of Advice Letter 316-W

On May 16, 2022, the Santa Clara Valley Water District (Valley Water) increased the groundwater charges levied upon Great Oaks' groundwater production. A copy of the Valley Water Resolution adopted on May 16, 2023 is is attached hereto as Exhibit A.¹ The higher groundwater charges are effective July 1, 2023, the same date that the Great Oaks Escalation Year begins under Great Oaks Advice Letter 315-W, filed May 9, 2023.

The increase in groundwater charges is being included in rates because such charges are pass-through costs. In 2021, the Water Division of the Commission requested that instead of recovering increased costs due to the higher pump taxes levied by Valley Water through a surcharge, Great Oaks should request the additional cost recovery through a change in base rates. This Advice Letter 316-W complies with that Water Division's request.

Great Oaks Advice Letter 315-W was filed on May 9, 2023 to establish rates for the 2023/2024 rate year. The amount of groundwater charges included in the Advice Letter 315-W rate calculations was \$11,729,062. The groundwater charges that will be in effect from July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024 are \$1,974.00 per Acre Foot (AF) in Zone W-2 and \$657.50 per AF in Zone W-7. The adopted percentage of water in the two Zones, per D.23-04-004, is 56% Zone W-2 and 44% Zone W-7.

With the adopted increase in groundwater charges, and using the same adopted quantities and percentages used in Advice Letter 315-W, the total amount of groundwater charges projected for the 2023/2024 rate year has increased by \$1,660,860, from \$11,729,062 to \$13,389,922, as shown on the Exhibit B AL 316-W Workpapers, at WP-1. The new, higher groundwater

charges represent an increase of 14.5% in Zone W-2 and an increase of 12.9% in Zone W-7.

Calculation of Total Groundwater Charges

The increase in groundwater charges also results in increases in Account 775 Uncollectible Expenses (increase of \$3,835, from \$43,712 to \$47,547) and in Account 796 Franchise Requirements (increase of \$39,786, from \$454,387 to \$494,173). The total increase in the revenue requirement resulting from the increase in groundwater charges is \$1,704,482, from \$23,004,183 (Advice Letter 315-W) to \$24,708,664 (Advice Letter 316-W). This represents an increase in the revenue requirement of 7.4% over the revenue requirement of Advice Letter 315-W. The entire increase is the result of Valley Water's higher groundwater charges.

Compliance with D.22-08-023

As the requested increase in revenues is greater than one percent (1%) of total revenues requested in Advice Letter 315-W, in the table below, Great Oaks provides the Affordability Metrics for the requested increase in this Advice Letter 316-W.

Other Pending Advice Letter

At the time of this filing, Great Oaks Advice Letter 315-W is pending. The revenues and rates requested in Advice Letter 315-W provide the basis for this Advice Letter 316-W, and both have the same requested effective date of July 1, 2023.

Effects on Average Customer Bills

The effect of the new and higher pump tax on the bill of an average singlefamily residential customer with a 3/4" x 3/4" meter using 10 CCF of water per month is \$8.59 (6.35%) per <u>bimonthly bill</u>, as shown in the following table taken from the Exhibit B Workpapers, page WP-4.

This is a Tier 1 Advice Letter pursuant to General Order 96-B and Water Industry Rule 7.3.1(7).

Notice was provided by publishing a legal notice in the form attached hereto as Exhibit C in the San Jose Mercury News, a newspaper of local circulation, pursuant to General Order 96-B, Water Industry Rule 3.1. Proof of publication will be provided to the Commission when Great Oaks receives such proof from the newspaper. This Advice Letter is also being served upon the Distribution List provided below.

Protests and Responses

Anyone may protest and respond to this Advice Letter. A Response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the Advice Letter. A Protest objects to the Advice Letter in whole or in part and must set forth specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds may be based upon the following:

(1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the Advice Letter; or

(2) The relief requested in the Advice Letter would violate a statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies; or

(3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the Advice Letter contain material error or omissions; or

(4) The relief requested in the Advice Letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or

(5) The relief requested in the Advice Letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the Advice Letter process; or

(6) The relief requested in the Advice Letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a Protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission).

Any Protest or Response must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division of the Commission within 20 days of the date this Advice Letter is filed. The Advice Letter process does not provide for any Protests, Responses or other comments, except for a reply by Great Oaks, after the 20-day comment period expires. SPECIAL CONDITIONS

1. The Santa Clara Valley Water District requires the customer to certify the water is used to irrigate commercial agricultural crops for sale to qualify for this rate. It is an express condition of this Irrigation Service that the customer cooperates in making the necessary certification to the Water District.

2. The Santa Clara Valley Water District has surcharges or discounts applicable to water used to irrigate commercial agricultural crops if the customer/farmer participates in the Water District's special programs. These surcharges or discounts are applied per Acre Ft., are granted or imposed by the Water District each month based on the customer's/farmer's level of participation, and will be passed through by the Company each month to the customer/farmer.

3. All bills are subject to the reimbursement fee set forth in Schedule No. UF.

4. To provide funding for the Utility's Customer Assistance Program (CAP), as described in Tariff Rule 22, a surcharge of \$0.1374 will be added to the Quantity Charge for all (I) water sold to non-CAP participants on and after July 1, 2023.

5. Customers who receive water deliveries for agricultural purposes under this schedule, and who present evidence to the Utility that such deliveries qualify for the lower pump tax rates levied by the Santa Clara Valley Water District for agricultural water, shall receive a credit of \$3.3163 per 100 (R) cu.ft. used during the period covered by that bill on and after July 1, 2023.

RESOLUTION NO. 23-

DETERMINING GROUNDWATER PRODUCTION CHARGES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023–2024

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Santa Clara Valley Water District (Valley Water) does find and declare as follows:

- That pursuant to Section 26.5 of the Santa Clara Valley Water District Act ("District Act"), a written report detailing Valley Water's activities in the protection and augmentation of the water supplies of Valley Water has been prepared including: a financial analysis of Valley Water's water utility system, information as to the present and future water requirements of Valley Water, the water supply available to Valley Water, and future capital improvements and maintenance and operating requirements; a method of financing such requirements; a recommendation as to whether or not the groundwater production charge should continue to be levied in any zone or zones of Valley Water during the ensuing fiscal year; and a proposal of a rate per acre-foot for agricultural water and a rate per acre-foot for all water other than agricultural water for Zones W-2, W-5, W-7, and W-8;
- 2. That on the 24th day of February 2023, said report was duly delivered to the Clerk of the Valley Water Board;
- That the Clerk, pursuant to Section 26.6 of the District Act, gave due notice of the receipt of the report and of a public hearing to be held commencing on the 11th day of April 2023, by teleconference, videoconference, or both and in-person attendance at the time stated;
- 4. That on February 24, 2023, written notice was mailed to all owners and operators of water-producing facilities within Valley Water's boundaries, advising of the proposed groundwater production charge rates to be levied, and of the opportunities to be heard concerning such charges;
- That the Governor's Emergency Declaration related to COVID-19, and the Governor's Executive Order N-29-20 issued on March 17, 2020, allows attendance by members of the Board of Directors, Valley Water staff, and the public to participate and conduct public meetings and hearings by teleconference, videoconference, or both;
- 6. That pursuant to Section 26.6 of the District Act and consistent with the Governor's Executive Order N-29-20, on the 11th day of April 2023, at 1 p.m. a public hearing upon said report was duly commenced via teleconference, videoconference and in-person attendance, with the opportunity given to the public to comment, and was continued for further hearing to the evening of April 13, 2023 (teleconference, videoconference and inperson attendance in Morgan Hill) and again to the afternoon of April 25, 2023 (teleconference, videoconference and inperson attendance in the Valley Water Boardroom located at 5700 Almaden Expressway, San Jose), whereupon the hearing was concluded, more than 45 days after notice of the hearing was given;

- 7. That during said public hearing, additional information and evidence was provided that was considered by the Board in making its decision on groundwater production charges, and the public and all persons subject to groundwater production charges were invited to speak or present written comments at the public hearing;
- 8. That the charges established by this resolution are for the purpose of paying the cost of constructing, maintaining, and operating facilities to import water into Valley Water; paying the cost of purchasing imported water; paying the cost of constructing, maintaining, and operating facilities for groundwater recharge, surface distribution, and the purification and treatment of water; and paying the principal and interest of any bonded indebtedness or other financial obligations of Valley Water incurred for those purposes;
- 9. That this Board considered all comments objecting to the proposed groundwater production charge increases for Zones W-2, W-5, W-7, and W-8;
- 10. That this Board, based on the whole record before it, finds that the revenues derived from the groundwater production charges will not exceed the funds required to provide services to Zones W-2, W-5, W-7, and W-8, as authorized under the District Act, and that the amount levied does not and will not exceed the proportional cost of service; and
- 11. That the California Environmental Quality Act does not apply to approval of these charges pursuant to the statutory exemption set forth in California Code of Regulations Title 14, Chapter 3, Section 15273, because, as identified in Valley Water's annual report on the protection and augmentation of the water supplies of Valley Water, the charges are expressly made for the purpose of:
 - a. Meeting operating expenses, including employee wage rates and fringe benefits;
 - b. Purchasing or leasing supplies, equipment, or materials;
 - c. Meeting financial reserve needs; and
 - d. Obtaining funds for capital projects necessary to maintain service within existing service areas.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Santa Clara Valley Water District as follows:

FIRST: Valley Water activities in the geographic area identified as Zone W-2 benefit said zone and those who rely directly or indirectly upon the groundwater supplies of such zone and water imported into such zone; Valley Water activities in the geographic area of Valley Water identified as Zone W-5 benefit said zone and those who rely directly or indirectly upon the groundwater supplies of such zone and water imported into such zone; Valley Water identified as Zone W-7 benefit said zone and those who rely directly or indirectly upon the groundwater supplies of such zone and water identified as Zone W-7 benefit said zone and those who rely directly or indirectly upon the groundwater supplies of such zone and water imported into such zone; and Valley Water activities in the geographic area of Valley Water identified as Zone W-8 benefit said zone and those who rely directly or indirectly upon the groundwater supplies of such zone; and valley water imported into such zone. Revenues derived from groundwater production charges shall be used only for such activities as authorized under the District Act.

SECOND: Based upon the findings and determinations from said hearing, the entire record presented to the Board and results of protests received, the Board hereby determines that fiscal year 2023–2024 groundwater production charges per acre-foot for agricultural water and water other than agricultural water should be increased. Accordingly, such charges shall be, and are hereby set as follows on all persons operating groundwater-producing facilities in Zone W-2 of Valley Water for fiscal year 2023–2024 (July 1, 2023–June 30, 2024) at the following per acre-foot rates:

Accordingly, such charges shall be, and are hereby set as follows on all persons operating groundwater-producing facilities in Zone W-5 of Valley Water for fiscal year 2023–2024 (July 1, 2023–June 30, 2024) at the following per acre-foot rates:

Great Oaks Water Company (Great Oaks) has filed Advice Letter (AL) 316-W with the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) to address higher groundwater charges (pump taxes) recently adopted by the Santa Clara Valley Water District. Current rates will apply to water sold through June 30, 2023 and will then be replaced by the new AL 316-W rates that include the new, higher pump tax. Under AL 316-W, Great Oaks' total revenue requirement increases by \$1,704,482 (7.4%) over previously authorized revenues. As shown in the table below, the average single-family residential customer bimonthly bill will increase by \$8.59 (6.35%), as compared to rates requested in Great Oaks AL 315-W. <u>Protests and Responses</u>: Anyone may protest and respond to this Advice Letter. A Response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the Advice Letters. A Protest objects to the Advice Letter in whole or in part and must set forth specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds may be based upon the following:

(1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the Advice Letters; or

(2) The relief requested in the Advice Letters would violate a statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies; or

(3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the Advice Letters contain material error or omissions; or

(4) The relief requested in the Advice Letters is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or

(5) The relief requested in the Advice Letters requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the Advice Letter process; or

(6) The relief requested in the Advice Letters is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a Protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission).

Any Protest or Response must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division of the Commission within 20 days of the date this Advice Letters are filed. The Advice Letter process does not provide for any Protests, Responses or other comments, except for a reply by Great Oaks Water Company, after the 20-day comment period expires.
