Advice Letter 331-W Great Oaks Water Company (U-162-W)

Great Oaks Water Company (Great Oaks) submits this Tier 1 Advice Letter to implement new tariffs and rates as authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission's (Commission) Decision (D.) 25-06-011 in Great Oaks' 2024 General Rate Case (GRC), Application (A.) 24-07-001. The proposed tariff sheets, reflecting the changes in Great Oaks' preliminary statement and rates are applicable throughout Great Oaks' entire service area are listed in the table below and attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Summary of Advice Letter 331-W

A. Commission Authorization for Advice Letter 331-W

In compliance with D.25-06-011, issued on June 20, 2025, which adopts a revenue requirement of \$26,163,591 for Test Year 2025-2026, Great Oaks hereby submits this advice letter to implement the newly adopted rates and charges and to establish a Battery Energy Storage System Memorandum Account as authorized in D.25-06-011.

This is the first advice letter being filed by Great Oaks to implement D.25-06-011. A subsequent advice letter will be submitted to remove the three closed memorandum accounts from Great Oak' Preliminary Statement, consistent with the approval of Advice Letter 326-W and the determinations in D.25-06-011. The Public Advocates Office and Great Oaks agreed that these memorandum accounts are closed and should be formally removed from the Preliminary Statement, as previously addressed in Advice Letter 326-W.

B. <u>Increase in monthly service credit</u>

In accordance with the agreement reflected in Advice Letter 326-W, Great Oaks is now adjusting the amount of service credit to reflect the increase in the service charge for the 2025-2026 Test year. As adopted in D. 25-06-011, the monthly service charge for a 5/8" meter increases from \$15.40 to \$20.68. Accordingly, this advice letter updates the service credit calculation. The monthly service credit will increase from \$7.12 to \$9.49, or from \$14.23 to \$18.98 on a two-month billing cycle.

Background

On June 12, 2025, the Commission adopted D.25-06-011 in A.24-07-001. Ordering Paragraph No. 1 and 3 state:

1. Great Oaks Water Company is granted \$26,211,243 in revenue requirement for Test Year 2025-2026 in this general rate case, and also \$28,233,964 and

\$30,694,529 for attrition years 2026-2027 and 2027-2028, respectively. Great Oaks must file a Tier 1 Advice Letter to implement the rates and charges authorized in this decision for rates effective July 1, 2025.

3. Great Oaks Water Company's (Great Oaks) capital project forecast is adopted. Great Oaks is authorized to file a Tier 1 Advice Letter to establish a Battery Energy Storage System Memorandum Account with a cap of \$1,500,000.

A summary explanation of the updated Tariff Sheets implementing the authorized rates and charges is provided below:

Discussion

- 1. Proposed new Tariff Sheet No. 1093-W Battery Energy Storage System

 Memorandum Account. D.25-06-011 grants Great Oaks the authority to establish a Battery Energy Storage System Memorandum Account. This new tariff sheet will be added to the preliminary statement. Proposed Tariff Sheet 1093-W complies with this directive.
- 2. Proposed Tariff Sheet No. 1094-W Schedule No. 1 General Metered Service. D.25-06-011 authorizes Great Oaks to recover Test Year 2025/2026 revenues in the amount of \$26,221,243. (D.25-06-011, OP 1, at p. 66.). D.25-06-011 provides the calculation of 5/8-inch meter equivalents for different meter sizes. Proposed Tariff Sheet No. 1094-W Schedule No. 1 General Metered Service reflects and complies with the adopted revenues, costs allocation, and meter sizing methodology.
- 3. <u>Proposed Tariff Sheet No. 1095-W Schedule No. 1 General Metered Service Tiered Rates.</u> D.25-06-011 authorizes Great Oaks to utilize tiered rates based on an agreed-upon rate design. Proposed Tariff Sheet No. 1095-W implements the adopted rate structure, consistent with the adopted revenues, costs allocation, and rate design.
- 4. Proposed Tariff Sheet No. 1096-W Schedule No. 1 General Metered Service Special Conditions. D.25-06-011 authorizes Great Oaks to fund its Customer Assistance Program (CAP) through a surcharge added to the quantity charge for all water delivered to Non-CAP customers. In addition, as directed by the Water Division, the amount of service credit is increased from \$14.23 to \$18.98 over the next six two-months billing cycles. Proposed Tariff Sheet No. 1096-W is submitted in compliance with these directives.
- 5. Proposed Tariff Sheet No. 1097-W Schedule No. 3M Irrigation Service. D.25-06-011 authorizes Great Oaks to charge irrigation customers the same uniform quantity charges and meter service charges as those applicable for General Metered Service. Proposed Tariff Sheet No. 1097-W is submitted in compliance with this directive.

6. Proposed Tariff Sheet No. 1098-W – Schedule No. 3M Irrigation Service Special Conditions. Great Oaks' authorized Irrigation Service rates include a surcredit for customers providing evidence to Great Oaks that the water use qualifies for lower pump tax rates levied by the Santa Clara Valley Water District for agricultural water. D.25-06-011 grants Great Oaks the authority to implement retail rate changes. Proposed Tariff Sheet 1098-W provides the amount of the surcredit to be received by qualified agricultural irrigation customers. Supporting calculations are provided below.

- 7. <u>Proposed Tariff Sheet No. 1099-W Private Fire Protection Service</u>. D.25-06-011 authorizes Great Oaks to recover Test Year 2025/2026 fire protection revenues of \$218,915. Proposed Tariff Sheet No. 1099-W includes the authorized rates for private fire protection service connections.
- 8. <u>Proposed Tariff Sheet No. 1100-W Schedule No. 6 Contract Resale Service</u>. D.25-06-011 authorizes Great Oaks to implement rates based upon adopted revenues, costs allocations, and meter sizes. Proposed Tariff Sheet No. 1100-W sets contract resale rates based upon these adopted values.

Additional Information

No Effect on Water Service

This filing has no effect on water service being provided to ratepayers.

Tier Designation

Pursuant to General Order 96-B and Water Industry Rule 7.3.1, this is a Tier 1 advice letter implementing rates and charges in compliance with D.25-06-011.

Requested Effective Date

Pursuant to D.25-06-011, the effective date of the new rates is July 1, 2025.

Notice

Anyone may protest and respond to this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. - (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter; or
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate a statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies; or
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions; or
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission).

- 1. <u>Purpose</u>. The purpose of the Battery Energy Storage System Memorandum Account (BESSMA) is to track and recover all capital and operating expenses associated with the development, installation and operation of battery storage systems. These costs include, but are not limited to:
 - a. Preliminary costs related to procurement or construction;
 - b. Design and engineering costs to support detailed project planning;
 - c. Capital expenditures related to hardware and installation;
 - d. Software, communication and integration costs; and
 - e. Ongoing operations and maintenance costs once the system is in service.
- 2. <u>Applicability</u>. The balance in the BESSMA shall not exceed \$1,500,000 without further Commission authorization. Recovery of costs shall apply to all customer classes except those specifically excluded by the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC).
- 3. <u>BESSMA Rates</u>. The BESSMA does not, by itself, include a rate recovery mechanism. The Utility must request recovery of the recorded costs in BESSMA in a future General Rate Case or through an advice letter filing. Cost recovery may result in changes to rates or an additional surcharge when amortized.
- 4. <u>Accounting Procedure</u>. The Utility shall maintain the BESSMA by making entries at the end of each month in which applicable expenses are incurred, as follows:
 - a. A debit entry shall be made to the BESSMA to record applicable expenses.
 - b. Interest shall accrue monthly by applying a rate equal to one-twelfth of the 3-month non-financial Commercial Paper Rate, as reported in the Federal Reserve Statistical Release, to the average of the beginning-of-month and the end-of-month balances.
 - 5. Effective Date. The BESSMA shall be effective July 1, 2025.

Customers who receive water deliveries for agricultural purposes under this schedule, and who present evidence to the Utility that such deliveries qualify for the lower pump tax rates levied by the Santa Clara Valley Water District for agricultural water, shall receive a credit of \$3.3099 per 100 cu.ft. used during the period covered by that bill on and after July 1, 2025. (T)
- 6. To refund a net over-collection in authorized balancing and memorandum accounts, a credit in the total amount of \$113.86 will be applied to the service charge portion of each customer's bill over a period of twelve months after the effective date of Advice (T)

 Letter 331-W, July 1, 2025. The amount of the credit per two-months billing cycle (T) will be \$18.98 over six billing cycles. The amount of the credit per one-month billing (R) cycle will be \$9.49 over twelve billing cycles. Only active customers with accounts established by December 31, 2023, will receive the credit against the service charge.

- 1. The fire protection service connection will be installed by the utility and the cost paid by the applicant. Such cost shall not be subject to refund.
- 2. The minimum diameter for fire protection service shall be two inches, and the maximum diameter shall not be more than the diameter of the main to which the service is connected.
- 3. If a distribution main of adequate size to serve a private fire protection system in addition to all other normal services does not exist in the street or alley adjacent to the premises to be served, then a service main from the nearest existing main of adequate capacity shall be installed by the utility and the cost paid by the applicant. Such payment shall not be subject to refund.
- 4. Service hereunder is for private fire protection systems to which no connections for other than fire protection purposes are allowed and which are regularly inspected by the underwriters having jurisdiction, and installed according to specifications of the utility, and are maintained to the satisfaction of the utility. The utility may install the standard detector type meter approved by the Board of Fire Underwriters for protection against theft, leakage or waste of water, and the cost paid by the applicant. Such payment shall not be subject to refund.
- 5. The utility will supply only such water at such pressure as may be available from time to time as a result of its normal operation of the system.
- 6. All bills within the City of San Jose are subject to a 2% Franchise Fee imposed by the City of San Jose on all customers within the City limits. The Franchise Fee is not in addition to the rates set forth on this Schedule No. 4, but are already included in the rates.
- 7. All bills are subject to the reimbursement fee set forth in Schedule No. UF.
